#### **CARING CONVERSATIONS**

Discuss in your household or small group:

- What different foods have you eaten today? What food have you enjoyed most of all?
- Jesus said that he was "bread from heaven," and that those who feed on him will live. In what ways is Jesus nourishment for you?
- How is your life different because you are nourished by Jesus?

### **DEVOTIONS**

Cut out pieces of paper in the shape of bread rolls or bread slices and mark each one with a cross. Position an empty plate in the middle of your home devotional area. When you gather, invite each person to offer a prayer request beginning with the words, "Jesus, bread of life, please...." For each prayer, place a piece of paper bread onto the plate.
