SAY, PRAY, AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week:

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CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- Talk about a time when you were with people that spoke a different language. How did you communicate?
- John 1:1-2 calls Jesus "the Word". What do you think this means?
- What steps has God taken to communicate with us? What do you do to communicate with God?

DEVOTIONS



Jesus has been called "God's love letter" to the world. As part of your home devotion times this week, have each household member compose a short letter to God (if you have young children in your home, help by writing down their words). Share your letters with one another. Say a prayer of thanks for God's communication with us in and through Jesus.

SERVICE



Jeremiah 31:8 speaks of God's care for pregnant women and women having their babies. Prepare "Thinking of You" cards to send to pregnant women in your congregation or community. You might also organize small baby gifts to present to them. Include pregnant mothers in your household prayers this week.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



In Ephesians 1:4-5, the apostle Paul tells us that long, long ago, God decided to adopt us into his family through Jesus Christ. Through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God has adopted us as his sons and daughters.

As a household activity for this week, design "Adoption Certificates" to display in your home. Include these words:

(Name) IS AN ADOPTED CHILD OF GOD THROUGH JESUS CHRIST.

For seals on your certificates, use the symbol of the dove, representing the Holy Spirit. (Ephesians 1:13-14) You could also include your baptism dates and details on your certificates.
