### **DEVOTIONS**



Reformation Day on October 31<sup>st</sup> recognizes the day in 1517 when Martin Luther posted *The 95 Theses* on the door of a church in Wittenberg, Germany. These statements were written to challenge the teachings and practices of the church in Luther's day. The first thesis states, "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said 'Repent,' he intended that the entire life of believers should be repentance." To repent is to turn to God in faith and be set free from our sins. In Christian worship it is expressed in the corporate confession:

"For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways."

Talk about what the gift of repentance and forgiveness means to you. Then pray the above confessional prayer.

## **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**



In honor of the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation and Martin Luther's desire for people to read the Bible in their own language, read the passages from "Daily Bible Readings", texts that were selected for their influence on the early Reformers. Begin each reading by praying the following:

Dear God, just as you opened the hearts of the Reformers, so open my heart to receive the freedom and salvation of the gospel as a gift of grace. In Jesus' name, amen.

End each reading by singing A Mighty Fortress Is Our God (or the "Hymn of the Week") and use "A Blessing to Give" found in this Taking Faith Home.
